

Travelling preparation

If we could ask our cat “Would you like to come on vacation with us?” He would answer “Yes but not by car, by train or by plane; only by teleportation!”

Cats hate changing their habits and being confined. Ideally, get him boarded in a place where there is interaction. Never more than two days alone at home

If you decide to travel with your cat: give a small meal two hours before the trip, put him in a small dog cage so he can see outside and speak to him. Plan to stop every three hours. Some cats that salivate and yell, they will need a tranquilizer prescribed by a veterinarian.

Travelling outside the country:

Your cat’s vaccines must be up to date. Every country has its own requirements for the importation of domestic animals. It is important to visit the following website a couple of months before the trip and let your veterinarian know about it so he can help prepare the necessary documents for the trip.
